

1. How can I write the Moves of a Game of Chess? Part 1

For most chess moves, you write down **the name of the piece** followed by **the square the piece just moved to**. Use the following abbreviations for the pieces:

N is for Knight **B** is for Bishop **R** is for Rook **Q** is for Queen **K** is for King

If the **White Bishop** on **f1** moves to the **c4** square, you will write **Bc4**.

If the **Black Knight** on **g8** moves to the **f6** square, you will write **Nf6**.

If the **White King** on **e1** moves to the **f2** square, you will write **Kf2**.

Pawns have **no** abbreviation. For **Pawn** moves you will write **the square the Pawn moved to**.

If the **White Pawn** on **e2** moves to the **e4** square, you will write **e4**.

If the **Black Pawn** on **d7** moves to the **d6** square, you will write **d6**.

Please write the moves for **both** the **White** and **Black** players as your teacher demonstrates the following game.
